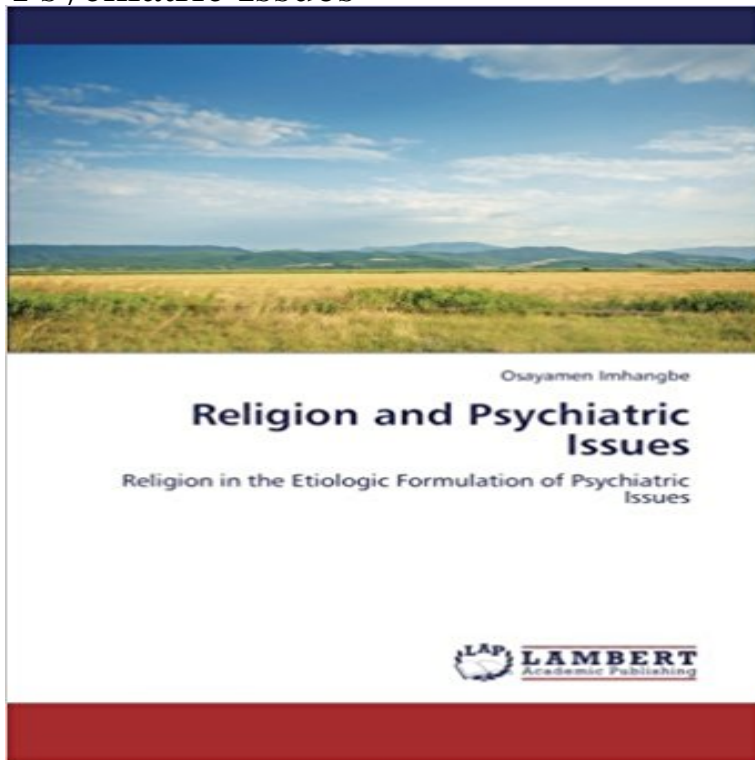


Religion and Psychiatric Issues: Religion in the Etiologic Formulation of Psychiatric Issues
